Political and competencial organization

State Spanish Constitution (SC)

(it allows a degree of self-government to the AC) In educational matters, it sets and regulates:

- -The general organization of the Educational System.
- -The general program of Education under the terms established in the SC (art. 27)
- -Fixing the core curriculum and the regulation of the other conditions for obtaining, issuing and recognising academic and professional certificates approved throughout the Spanish territory.
- -The high inspection and other organs under SC Article 149.1.30., are to ensure compliance with the obligations of public authorities.

Autonomous Communities (17) Statutes of Autonomy (EA)

(they legally regulate their organization and operation)
In educational matters they have full or shared decision-making power


